




About HSC's Learning for Life Programme

1) Purpose of CCA

4) **LEAPS 2.0**

LEAPS 2.0 is a framework to recognise secondary school students' holistic development. Students will be recognised with levels of attainment in four domains:

- Participation
- Achievement
- Leadership
- Service





4.1) Level of attainment



At the end of the graduating year, students' co-curricular attainment will be recognised according to Excellent/ Good/ Fair. The level of attainment will be converted to a bonus point(s) which can be used for admission to Junior College/ Polytechnics/ Institutes of Technical Education (JC/Poly/ITE).

Co-curricular Attainment	Details		
Excellent (2 bonus points)	Student who attains a minimum Level 3 in all four domains with at least a Level 4 in one domain.		
Good (1 bonus point)	Student who attains a minimum Level 1 in all four domains with any one of the following: i. At least Level 2 in three domains; ii. At least Level 2 in one domain and at least Level 3 in another domain iii. At least Level 4 in one domain.		
Fair	Student's attainment in co-curricular will not translate into any bonus point.



Secondary 2 Progression to Sec 3

Posting group	Minimum Attainment Level
2 Express	Pass in English and a pass percentage in the average of all subjects
2 Normal Academic	Pass in English and two other subjects or Pass in 4 subjects
2 Normal Technical	Pass two subjects one of which should be English or Mathematics



Subject Allocation Beliefs

Secondary 2 subject allocation exercise for Secondary 3 2025 is anchored on the beliefs that:

GCE O-Level Elective Subjects

Students have the option of offering one of the following as an additional subject if they meet the criteria:

- Music (O-level) at an O-level music centre
 - more information will be sent out via Parents Gateway in Semester 2
- Computing (O-level) at Ngee Ann Secondary School [New!]
 - more information will be sent out via Parents Gateway by 28 March 2024

Before signing up for the subject, students should take the following factors into consideration:

- Commitment (eg. 2 years of rushing after school for lesson held at external centres).
- Ability to cope with the overall academic demand (8 or 9 subjects)
- Overall performance in Sec 1 & 2
